DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Two years ago, as we set the season for the 2020 Chapin Theatre Company, I said: "I'll direct *Closed for the Holidays* in December of that year." The first show of 2020, *The Outsider*, finished with great audiences, the 2nd show, *Clue*, was cast and COVID struck! Our theatre, as did many amateur and professional, went dark.

So here we are in 2021, finally in production for *Closed for the Holidays (C4H)*, and I am realizing that putting 20 people on a stage the size of ours is indeed a miracle! I was a television producer/director for over 42 years, but that's a long way from stage directing! People in Chapin know me more for my onstage work and working in concessions. But directing has let me rediscover the joy of stage work. Our cast has 9 adults and 11 students, and their work space is tiny—to put it mildly. When everyone is backstage waiting to come on there's hardly room to breathe! A lot goes into bringing a play to life: first you cast and hope that your vision of the character can be made real by the performer you have selected. Then you begin blocking, meaning you decide when and where the characters move and ask the actors to make it real. What a joy to see multiple ages on stage act and interact with one another. They are all deeply invested in this show in terms of time, talent and imagination—and it shows.

Directing is also like teaching. As I watch rehearsals I see little things that an actor does or doesn't do that remind me of what I learned and why... how to "stay open," how not to "upstage" another actor, how to "do an open turn." A director is constantly concerned with volume, characterization, and most importantly the stage picture. The final play that you enjoy is a labor of love from the director, cast and crew to you, the audience. Thanks to the board of Chapin Theatre Company for trusting me to direct. To the audience, thank you for coming to "C4H." All of the work that we have put in to rehearsing and performing would be wasted without you. Your laughter, chuckles, "ahhs" and applause are to us the icing on the cake!
